

A Message from Dr. Murabito, President of NCCC

On September 25, 2020, the Chancellor of The State University of New York (SUNY), Dr. Jim Malatras, shared with all campuses a new policy for addressing COVID-19 public health violations. This policy sets forward uniform sanctions to be applied across the board for all students at all SUNY campuses who may have violated the COVID-19 public health safety protocols.

We at Niagara County Community College take these safety protocols very seriously. The protocols implemented on our campus are just one way we can ensure that our students, faculty, and staff stay healthy during this public health crisis. Students, faculty, and staff are strongly encouraged to follow the reasonable requirements of wearing masks/coverings, socially distancing, avoiding crowds, participating in COVID-19 testing, filling out daily health surveys before arrival on campus, reporting positive test results, and following all directives of campus, local, and State health officials.
