## Vaccines Point to Brighter Future

When the COVID vaccines were first rolled out in December, New York State was one of the biggest focuses. According to the state of New York's government website, Governor Andrew Cuomo administered 38,000 vaccines by December 21st- which at the time was the most in the country. From New York State's COVID-19 Vaccine Tracker, as of March 31st, there have been over 6,098,998 individuals in New York who have received their first dosage of the vaccine, and 3,566,509 individuals in New York who have received both dosages of their vaccine. Of course with New York City being one of the hot spots of the coronavirus pandemic, their counties have received high vaccination numbers. According to New York State's COVID-19 Vaccine Tracker, in Bronx County, 319,145 individuals have received their first dose, and 194,149 with both doses. In Kings County 593,278 have received their first dose, and 327,040 both doses. Many other counties in New York State like New York, Monroe, Nassau, Onondaga, Queens, Suffolk, and Westchester County all have very high

dosage numbers.

When looking into the future on the vaccine numbers, the only way to go is up. With Governor Cuomo announcing this past Monday that New Yorkers thirty years of age and older can begin to schedule appointments and get vaccinated, beginning on March 30th, and New Yorkers sixteen years of age and older can begin to schedule appointments and get vaccinated beginning April 6th. With this announcement coming from Cuomo, this opens lots of new opportunities for individuals of New York State to become vaccinated. To find out if you or another individual you may know is eligible to be vaccinated, you can visit <https://covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/>

When it comes to other vaccines, like Johnson & Johnson, and Astrazeneca, many wonder if they will see the light of day in New York State. Coming from the 'Am I Eligible' from the New York State COVID-19, it shows that individuals can begin receiving the Johnson & Johnson Vaccine beginning on April 17th, on New York State Fairgrounds. When it comes to Astrazeneca being

available for distribution, NBC News states how many are still worrisome of the Astrazeneca vaccine due to other countries halting it from use due to the cause of blood clots, and the limited data that has been released to the public, and that the United States has purchased 300 Million doses of their vaccine, and plans to use them if passed by the FDA Advisory Committee in May. The Astrazeneca vaccine is still a work in progress while it is only at 67 percent effective, according to Dr. Sanjay Gupta, an American Neurosurgeon, when speaking to reporters from CNN. He goes on how he isn't sure if the US should authorize this vaccine, due to the limited amount of data they have released to the public, but then states it's up to the advisory committee and the FDA. Dr. Fauci states the limited data is an unforced error, wish-

ing that they released all of their data and believes that it is a good vaccine.

As many more individuals become vaccinated within the United States, we can only hope to return to what was normalcy. Many other states have begun to give those opportunities to those individuals who have been vaccinated. For example, the State of California, according to KTLA 5 Los Angeles, will allow indoor concerts, theater performances, and other private gatherings, required to be at a limited capacity or require proof of vaccination. It is only a matter of time for other companies to hop along the vaccine train, and while other ones we know of perfect theirs, so that individuals who need or want to become vaccinated, can have what they have been wishing for.

## Boulder and Other Recent Shootings Spark Gun Debate

With a country heavily divided when it comes to the discussion of our Second Amendment, there are those who believe stricter gun laws won't prevent mass shootings, while others believe that stricter gun laws could be the answer. According to the NPR, the U.S. is has the 32nd highest gun death rate in the world. In the midst of a global pandemic, America battles another epidemic; the gun violence epidemic.

Mass shootings are defined as four or more injuries and/or fatalities, following an individual incident. This year alone, the United States has tragically suffered over 110 mass shootings, Gun Violence Archive's statistics show. Statistics also show that last year, the United States reported 611 mass shootings and in 2019, a reported 417 mass shootings.

Recent events in Boulder, Colorado are becoming more and more common in America. On March 23rd, gunman Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa, open fired in a local King Sooper's grocery store, in Boulder, Colorado. Fox News live-streamed the deadly events, as they unfolded that evening. The attack left 10 victims dead, including police officer Eric Talley, and another two severely injured.

The shooter's motives are still unknown, according to investigators. However, USA Today, and other news publications have suggested that Ali suffered possible mental illness, and began to act paranoid. Testimonials on his well-being were given from his parents and brother, with hope to find an answer to what lead to this deadly outburst that continues to leave the Boulder Community in grief.

Headlining major news outlets now, are three separate shootings that left two dead and eight others injured, in Virginia Beach. The series of shootings took place only a few days after Boulder's massacre, on March 26th. Police reports stated that one of the gun incidents erupted from physical altercations while the other two are still being investigated, but believed to have been connected. Information on the suspects involved in the shootings have yet to be released to the public.

In addition to the Atlanta shooting spree that left eight dead, America now mourns the loss of more victim's lives taken away from gun violence. Recent shootings have also left many Americans wondering what the solution will be to put an end to the rising trend of deadly shootings affecting our communities each year.

The Biden administration responded with the proposal of two gun bills. One would establish background checks for firearm sales between private parties. The other would prevent gun sales from going through before the completion of a background check. Biden told the Washington Press on March 24th, "Another American city has been scarred by gun violence and the resulting trauma," and that he hopes he has the political capital to move forward with stricter gun safety measures.

On the opposite side of the spectrum, republicans have completely rejected the Biden Administration's calls for action. The GOP argues against limiting gun rights and suggested making steps towards policy making. Following Biden's call to ban assault weapons, Senator Ted Cruz weighed in on the subject, "The jurisdictions in this country with the strictest gun control have among the highest rates of crime and murder. When you disarm law-abiding citizens, you make them more likely to be victims," he said. "If you want to stop these murders, go after the murderer," as reported by USA Today.

With the Democratic and Republican Party sharing opposing viewpoints on the gun violence

epidemic, the two gun bills have completely halted in the divided senate. Stalling of the legislation has prompted the White House to consider executive action, if congress is unwilling to move forward with the bills, Kamala Harris told CBS.

While politicians are continuing to speak out on recent shooting events, gun control activists have made sure to have the voices be heard, as well. Manuel Oliver, father who lost his son to the Parkland High School shooting, in 2018, spoke with the Washington Post about gun violence. "Solutions are not the priority for our politicians. It's never ending. I know what those families are going through exactly and it makes me sick," he told reporters. "And it makes me feel that we are not doing enough."

Tony Montalto, another parent who lost his child in the Parkland shootings, also voiced his concerns for recent events in Boulder. "We need to get past the extremist arguments and come together to pass laws that will make our schools and our communities safer," Montalto said. "We want to keep firearms in the hands of responsible owners, we believe responsible ownership starts when you are able to pass a background check."

## Editorial: Crisis at the Border or Crisis in The White House?

When someone we are told to trust, believe, and put our faith in tells us they are going to do something we normally tend to believe it. That was the case when President Joseph Biden said to the world through his social media twitter account on August 21, 2019 "It is cruel and abhorrent to strip migrant children of the few protections they have. It's not enough this administration puts children in cages without soap and beds, now it wants to keep them there indefinitely. This isn't who we are," But, this is exactly who he is three months into his presidency with over 3,700 unaccompanied migrant children in US government custody, a record high with most being held past the three-day legal limit. As Democrats lined up in front of congress in July testifying about border conditions they did not hold back. "It is a policy of dehumanizing," said Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, D-N.Y. Another congressional member Rep. Rashida Tlaib, D-Mich., said, "We do have a crisis at our border. It is one of morality." So here we are entering April. Border facilities in the Rio Grande Valley, the epicenter of the recent surge are holding 10 times their capacity of migrants.

As Michelle Obama said at the Democratic National Convention in 2020, "They watch in horror as children are torn from their families into cages." A very powerful and truthful statement about the policy her own husband started and did not end before leaving office. The reason for the "cages" was a sudden influx of migrants in 2014 according to Jeh Johnson, Barrack Obama's Homeland Security Director; he also stated

how the cages pre date the Trump administration. There are countless government documents that show that the cages were indeed built and funded in fiscal year 2015. So for the left to apply pressure on this situation and use it as a key piece in most of their campaigns is almost fraudulent at least to me.

A CBS news article from July 10th 2020, states how President Biden pledged on July 8th of 2020 not to hold migrant children in detention centers if he were elected president; several lawmakers attested to this. Fast forward past the election, inauguration, we arrive at February 22nd 2021 when the Biden Administration opens its first migrant facility for children. Then on February 24th President Biden denies the allegations even though they are 100 percent proven facts. So now we have our current President caught in multiple lies and hypocrisy within his first 32 days in office.

According to Vice President Kamala Harris her thoughts on children detention centers in June of 2020 went as "it is immoral it is wrong and it is unnecessary... this is not reflective as who we are as a country." Fast forward to July of 2020 she says "You look at the fact that this is a president who has pushed policies that's been about putting babies in cages at the border in the name of security when in fact what it is, is a human rights abuse being committed by the United States Government ." — remarks at NAACP forum on July 26th, 2020 in Detroit. A CNN article published March 24th 2021, states that the number of children arrested at the border in March

will likely easily surpass the high during May 2019 when around 11,400 unaccompanied children were arrested, according to the preliminary government data that CNN reviewed for this article. In June 2019, Harris once again spoke about her views during a Democratic primary debate, stating that if elected president, one of her first actions would be reinstating DACA. "I will also immediately put in place a meaningful process for reviewing the cases for asylum. I will release children from cages. I will get rid of the private detention centers," Harris said during the debate. So for her to say this and be doing the exact opposite, putting even more kids in cages than the man she criticized so openly and harshly for doing so, even after being tasked with stemming the migration problem this past week. So after being placed fully in charge of the issue, making claims she would do one thing and now has the power too, but is still carrying out the practices she was so very against, what does that make her?

There is no correct way to handle the Border Crisis which is why our country has been struggling with it through three presidencies and almost 15 years. The issue is that our public leaders, the people we trust to make decisions for us are bluntly lying about their beliefs. If President Biden and Vice President Harris cared so much about the children in cages, there would already be an alternative. But now we have seen the problem passed from President to Vice President with no real constructive change anywhere in sight, even though that is what they promised. To belittle former President Trump and call out all the wrong things being

done about this situation just to do it exactly himself and herself is something that people should be talking about. The two most powerful people in our country degraded countless leaders about this policy, made promises to change it, and are now putting more kids in cages than ever before. It is sickening.

To top it all off they just recently put a restriction on how much information can be shared with the media about this issue. According to multiple news sources at the height of the Trump administration's child separation policy in June 2018, it allowed media to tour facilities where separated children were held. But now, President Biden who has continually preached about how open and transparent he would be with the American people, is doing quite the opposite. So not only did they lie and not follow their convictions, they also are trying to hide the wrong doing by silencing the media on the issue.

If we look at this issue lightly it will just continue to grow, yes the border issue but the bigger issue of letting our elected officials take advantage of the public with no repercussions. Covid-19 has been very tough for NCCC's award-winning athletic department. Recently, NCCC launched a campaign to help fund all of the school's athletics. That has been really helping the school's sports teams get back up on their feet. Many of the sports teams, like women's basketball, have been affected by the pandemic. However, they are just starting to get back in the game.

The girls had a very close call for their first game back on the court against Lackawanna on February 28. The final score was 97-96. They were winning in the first and third quarters, but that wasn't enough to defeat Lackawanna, who won big-time in the second and fourth quarters. NCCC sophomore Alaina Forbes led the T-Wolves with 26 points and 8 rebounds, while freshman Gabrielle McDuffie finished with 21 points, 13 rebounds, and 5 assists. Seven other T-Wolves got into the score column with each of them net-

ting at least 5 points.

Even though our ladies had a rough start to the season, they pulled themselves together for their first win against Bryant and Stratton in Buffalo on March 15 with a final score of 90-74. Freshman Gabrielle McDuffie stuffed the stat sheet with 17 points, 10 rebounds, 9 steals, and 4 assists in the victory. Classmate Kiya Marquez had 16 points, 5 boards, and 4 assists, sophomore Alaina Forbes finished with 13 points, 6 assists, and 5 steals and freshman Olivia Smith canned four 3-pointers for 12 points. Sophomore Taylor Lockwood added 11 points and 4 rebounds for NCCC, which shot 50 percent from the field and held a 54-30 lead at the half.

In a recent game on March 25 against Bryant and Stratton College in Albany, NCCC won their .500 mark back with a victory of 67-60. The team has been back in the season since March 1. Freshman Aichata Ballo led N-Trip with 17 points, 6 rebounds, 4 assists, and 4 steals.

Sophomore Alaina Forbes added 13 points and classmate Taylor Lockwood had 10 points and 6 boards. The T-Wolves held a 52-37 edge on the glass in the win.

NCCC defeated the Jamestown Jayhawks on March 30 in a close game with a final score of 94-89. The Thunderwolves improved to 7-4 overall and 3-1 in regional play, while JCC dropped to 3-7, 1-3. Sophomore Alaina Forbes led NCCC with 20 points and seven rebounds, while freshman Gabrielle McDuffie added 19 points and 15 boards. Freshman Meghan Gill had a career-high 10 points off the bench. The T-Wolves collected 37 offensive rebounds in the win.

The team had a rough start to the season with that devastating loss against Lackawanna, but then they picked themselves right back up for an amazing win against Bryant and Stratton/ Buffalo. They are off to a fantastic start to the season.

Our ladies have a winning record of 7-4 so far in the spring 2021 season. At this rate, it looks like NCCC will keep its award-winning title in our athletic department. All of our teams are doing a fantastic job, but these women are really bringing us home with all of these amazing wins. Thank you, ladies, for all of your hard work. You're all doing an amazing job! # Legalization Of Marijuana on the Way in NYS

For many years, the process of legalizing marijuana has been incredibly anticipated. Over the recent weeks, information has been released, sharing that the use of recreational marijuana would be allowed sooner than we thought. In the morning on Wednesday, March 31st, Governor Andrew Cuomo signed a bill that legalized recreational marijuana in New York State. The bill was passed the night before, and this makes New York, as well as the District of Columbia, the 15th state to have legalized cannabis for adult recreational use. Many people throughout New York State have been waiting for this to happen for years, though some are also against it. In my article, I will be discussing what we can expect over the next few years now that cannabis is legalized, and how legalization is now being incorporated into our society.

Although the use of recreational marijuana has been legalized, the sale of the plant has not. Legal recreational sales of the drug are not expected to begin for about one or two years. This decision to make marijuana legal now allows for possession of up to three ounces of cannabis and twenty-four grams of cannabis

concentrate. People are also allowed to grow up to six plants in their own homes without facing criminal charges.

It has also sparked the creation of the Office of Cannabis Management, which will be an independent agency that operates with the New York State Liquor Authority. This agency will regulate the cannabis market and the existing medical cannabis programs. It will be overseen by a Cannabis Control Board. The board will consist of five members, three of whom are appointed by the governor, and one each appointed by the State Senate and State Assembly.

Even with these measures, many individuals disagree with this decision. The New York Parent-Teacher Association and police groups around the state fear that the legalization of the plant will be a risk to children and that it will cause the roads to become more dangerous to the public. To reassure the public, New York officials are planning to launch an education and prevention campaign. This is being done to help reduce the risk of cannabis use among young individuals. Schools will be eligible for programs on prevention and aware-

ness. The state also plans to begin a study that will examine how people drive under the influence of cannabis. Even though the law was just recently passed, many precautions and rules have been made to assure that recreational cannabis doesn't negatively impact our economy.

Now that recreational marijuana has been legalized in New York State, it has begun the process of being incorporated into aspects of our everyday lives. An example of this can be found in NCCC's Culinary Department. The department has created the Culinary Cannabis and Edibles course, which allows students to study the basic information on cannabis as a whole, while also delving into the more financial and legal issues that surround the culinary cannabis industry. The course will include other information such as plant anatomy, cannabis shopping/storage/cooking, and the history of cannabis. All information about this course can be found on the official NCCC website. The Horticulture Department has also created a course of study based on the growth of cannabis. Students who graduate from the Horticulture program with an emphasis on cannabis can pursue various careers

in the cannabis industry. Careers such as cultivation, production managers, master growers are available to graduates of this specific area. The classes related to this curriculum include basic plant studies, management, and health that help to ensure that students are utilizing the latest research and techniques for this career path. The information for this program can also be found on NCCC's website.

These are just a few local examples of how cannabis is now being introduced to our economy. The legalization of recreational marijuana may be considered a historic day by many individuals around the state. This is an event that a lot of people have been waiting for a very long time. Though many people may never get used to or accept this new change in our society, others feel that marijuana can be helpful in many ways. I feel that this new bill doesn't show a threat to our economy and that substance abuse of the plant can be controlled in a manner that doesn't negatively affect people. Recreational marijuana is now becoming a major influence in people's lives, and it is something that I feel will be an important part of our history in years to come.

## Spring 2021 Deadline to Request an S/U/W Grade or Withdraw from the College

Monday, April 19 is the last day to withdraw from a class (W grade) or request an S/U (Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory) grade. April 19 is also the last day to withdraw from the College with X grades (applies to all full-term courses). Mod courses differ in deadlines – refer to the online Student Calendar for more information.

All forms are located on the Registration & Records Office Forms page (from the NCCC homepage click Academics, Registration & Records, Forms).

- **Withdraw from a Class - To drop a course and receive a W (withdrawal grade) as a final grade, complete the electronic Drop or Withdraw from a Course form.**
- **Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) Grades - To elect to receive a Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory final grade in a course, students must submit the electronic S/U grade request form. Students must initiate the electronic S/U grade request and complete the electronic form, which will require approvals from the course instructor and the student's advisor.**
- **Withdraw from College (All Classes) - To withdraw online from the college and receive "X" grades for ALL of your current courses, complete the electronic Withdrawal from College form available on the Registration & Records webpage under Forms. (If you completed any modular courses, you will receive the grade earned and "W" grades will be applied to all other college coursework.)**
