According to <u>Mental Health America</u>, nearly 1 in 5 American adults will have a diagnosable mental health condition in any given year and 46% of Americans will meet the criteria for a diagnosable mental health condition sometime in their life. Burnout is also on the rise. A survey conducted of 1,500 U.S. workers by <u>Indeed</u> found that over half (52%) of survey respondents are experiencing burnout in 2021 – up from the 43% who said the same in Indeed’s pre-COVID-19 survey. Burnout is not a medical diagnosis, but it can be a step in the path towards other kinds of problems, like depression or anxiety.</p> <p>During this presentation, we will cover the following topics: an overview of mental health and burnout, strategies for managing mental health and burnout in the workplace, and takeaways for individuals to play an active role in their personal wellbeing journey.</p>

The home care nurse role is the fastest growing nursing field as patients are being discharged quicker from the hospital and convalescing at home. At the college we have a room set up as the “home care room.” It is set up as a studio apartment. However, in the current model of delivery students miss opportunities to assess this home care room fully.</p> <p>This IRC grant provided an immersive experience that revealed this studio apartment in a 360 view. This created an immersive home care nurse experience available to students. Students were provided a case study scenario to prepare them for the experience. They were provided</p>
